



WOMEN'S HORMONE PANEL

About This Test

This panel includes tests to assess hormone levels specific to women's reproductive health, including estrogen, progesterone, follicle-stimulating hormone (FSH), luteinizing hormone (LH), estradiol, and estriol.

This test can be ordered to evaluate hormonal imbalances, investigate irregular menstrual cycles, fertility issues, or menopausal symptoms in women.

Note: Due to the intricate nature of the analysis involved, results for this test may require additional time for processing. Results will be available in approximately 3 – 5 days.

What Should I Do With My Results?

It is always recommended that you meet with a doctor to determine what your laboratory test results mean to you. Your doctor will review all of your test results and, combined with your health history, will be able to provide an accurate picture of your health status.

Abnormal results in a women's hormone panel could indicate hormonal imbalances, such as low estrogen or progesterone levels, which may lead to irregular periods, fertility issues, or menopausal symptoms like hot flashes.

High levels of certain hormones like FSH or LH may suggest conditions like polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS) or early menopause. These imbalances can affect reproductive health and overall well-being.
